1. Fusion Search on EDMT FusionView

The Fusion Search allows the user to search complex multiple type of data from different DB vendors on one single page. Returned results can be further processed and used with defined functions and special functions.

The three main sections (seperated with red dotted line) on the fusion search page are: 1) search area (at the top of the page), 2) results statistics area (in the middle of the page), and 3) results area (at the bottom part of the page).




Figure 1 – fusion search page

Searching with Fusion Search

First select one or more DBs (“*DB selection*”, *Figure 1*) where you want your search to take place. Then you need to select data types you are looking for (“*Search criteria*”, *Figure 1* - for example: “Messages”, “Documents”, “Transactions”, etc.) and for each of them you can add some conditions and click on the Search button. The content search condition (“*Additional criteria*”, *Figure 1*) supports full text search, proximity search, phrase search and more. To learn about the syntax of the content search queries, please visit the help page. Data that meet ALL conditions are shown in the corresponding Search Results area (“*Search results for all DBs*”, *Figure 1*).

Export search result to CSV

Searched results can be exported in CSV format using “Export” button (“*Export data*”, *Figure 1*). This is important for users who want to export specific data from the DB using search criteria.

Visualization of returned results

Sometimes a picture is worth a thousand words. Display your data using our visualization functions. First you need to do a search (See “*Searching with Fusion Search*”) and then to click on one of the gray button functions F1-F12 (“*User functions*”, *Figure 1*). New window will pop out showing your searched results on dual charts (“*Charts*”, *Figure 2*).

Using tooltips on EDMT FusionView




Figure 3 – field tooltip




Figure 4 – checkbox tooltip




Figure 5 – button tooltip

EDMT FusionView has a lot of functions and search fields. To see each field's range or its usage just hover over a question mark and a tooltip appears with an explanation (Figure 3). Buttons and some checkboxes have tooltips also, so hover over them too for more info. (Figure 4 and Figure 5)
